* Double <---> Distance

Give yourself extra braking time and space in case a patch of ice causes you to swerve.

* Slow Down!

Reduce Speed to counteract the traction lost due to the slick road surface.

You Cruise, You Lose

Avoid using cruise control in wet, icy, or snow conditions to maintain control of acceleration and deceleration at all times.

* Easy on the Turns...

Brake before the Turn, Accelerate after the Turn!

* Have an Emergency Kit.

Salt, shovel, towels, protein bars, flashlights, and flares — be ready for whatever may happen.

* Turn On Your Headlights!!

It's not just so you can see the road, it's so drivers ahead and behind you can see you in poor conditions.

* Plan Your Route

When roads are icy, you don't want to be in sudden stops or turns. Plan a route ahead of time and pick ones that avoid trouble areas.

Vehicle Checkup

Make sure your brakes are good, the tires have good tread and are inflated properly, and keep your gas tank half full.
